A Message from Fr. Kubista:

The five precepts of the Church help us to be members of the Mystical Body of Christ, the Church. The first precept is: "You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor". (We are not required to receive the Eucharist rather attend Mass.) The Code of Canon Law (CCL) says that Sunday is "the primordial holy day of obligation." (CCL 1246.§1) The CCL gives a number of Holy Days and says: "With the prior approval of the Apostolic See, however, the conference of bishops can suppress some of the holy days of obligation or transfer them to a Sunday." (CCL 1246.§2) The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) tells us to rest "from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days." (CCC 2042) The CCL expands on this and says: "they are to abstain from those works and [business] which hinder the worship to be rendered to God, the joy proper to the Lord's day, or the suitable relaxation of mind and body. "(CCL 1247) The obligation can be fulfilled on the day itself or "the evening of the preceding day." (CCL 1248)

The second precept is: "You shall confess your sins at least once a year." This precept "ensures preparation for the Eucharist by the reception of the sacrament of reconciliation, which continues Baptism's work of conversion and forgiveness." (CCC 2042) "After having reached the age of discretion, each member of the faithful is obliged to confess faithfully his or her grave [mortal] sins at least once a year." (CCL 989)

The third precept is connected to the second. It is: "You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season". (One has to receive the Eucharist to receive the sacrament.) This precept "guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord's Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian liturgy." (CCC 2042) The CCL expands on this. "After being initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, each of the faithful is obliged to receive holy communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled during the Easter season unless it is fulfilled for a just cause at another time during the year." (CCL 920.§1.§2)

The fourth precept is "You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church". "The divine law binds all the Christian faithful to do penance each in his or her own way. In order for all to be united among themselves by some common observance of penance, however, penitential days are prescribed on which the Christian faithful devote themselves in a special way to prayer, perform works of piety and charity, and deny themselves by fulfilling their own obligations more faithfully and especially by observing fast and abstinence." (CCL 1249) "The penitential days and times in the universal Church are every Friday of the whole year and the season of Lent." (CCL 1250) Those over 14 years old are to abstain from meat on Fridays in Lent, and abstain from meat and fast (for ages 18 to 59) on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The Pastoral Statement on Penance and Abstinence (1966) says that "Friday itself remains a special day of penitential observance throughout the year" which implies that some form of penance should be done every Friday. It continues that outside Lent, we are urged to make Friday "a day of self-denial and mortification in prayerful remembrance of the passion of Jesus Christ" and that abstaining from flesh meat is still considered the "first place" penance but other forms of penance (sacrifice) can be done instead.

The fifth precept is "You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church". "The Christian faithful are obliged to assist with the needs of the Church so that the Church has what is necessary for divine worship, for the works of the apostolate and of charity, and for the decent support of ministers." (CCL 222 §1)

We pray that God would help us to follow the precepts of the Church so we are strengthened as its members. God bless you.
