A Message from Fr. Kubista:

One of the challenges that we can experience, especially when we get older, is that of loneliness. Loneliness is feeling on our own. It is important that we turn to the Lord when we feel alone, realizing that it can be a way that He draws us closer to Himself.

Loneliness can be experienced at any stage in our lives and especially when we are older. Although today, loneliness seems to be growing in all ages in part because of technology and the lifestyle that we lead (our culture is more individualistic and isolated). Our children may not be exposed to interactions and things which foster community and togetherness. From a faith perspective, some think that coming together in a community to worship is not that important and they would rather worship on their own, and this attitude can foster a sense of loneliness. As human beings, we desire and our made for community. Yes, there can be times when we are alone, when we must be alone. Being together with others helps us and should encourage us to know that we are not alone.

When we feel lonely, we can have a sense of emptiness in our soul. We can feel that we are not loved or not appreciated by others. We can feel that we may not have a purpose or some reason for our existence. Feeling lonely might be that we are turned in on ourselves too much, we are not looking at the goodness that is within us, or we are not looking at the good that is outside of ourselves. We are to remember that God made us good, although broken. At times, though, we can lose this insight and forget that God made us and that we are made to be with Him. We can try to replace God with someone or something else, but these will never completely fill us, and there still can be a sense of being alone. Only God can completely fill us.

One of the ways to overcome loneliness is to realize that we are never alone. God is always near us, He is beside us (in our person as we are temples of the Holy Spirit). He wants to be our best friend and He wants to walk with us. We are to be mindful that this is what God did with Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden. He walked with them in the gentle breeze of the afternoon. God wants to do the same with each of us. He wants to walk with us, He wants to be so involved in our lives that we can feel Him or at least know that He is always there. We are to always be open to His soft and gentle way to be with us.

Sometimes, we feel alone because God wants us to open ourselves more to His love, to His gentle way of drawing us to Himself. We actually have to feel alone so that we turn to God for His help and support. It allows and helps us to realize that it really is Him; it can only be Him for there is no one else. Once we realize that we are never alone and that God is always with us, even when someone we love leaves us (dies), we are able to turn to the sure and steady support of the Lord.

If we are feeling lonely, turn to the Lord, pray to Him and ask Him to help us realize He is near. We can turn to others for strength and support but ultimately there will always be a void which only God can fill for only in Him will we find true rest. Jesus said: "Come to me all you who are weary and find life burdensome and I will give you rest for my yoke is easy and my burden is light." Each of us is made for God and only in Him will we feel whole and not alone. God bless you.
