For The Sake of His Sorrowful Passion, Have Mercy on Us and On The Whole World

A Message from Fr. Kubista:

We celebrate Easter Sunday, the Resurrection of Christ from the dead on the third. The Resurrection is one of the fundamental tenants of the Catholic faith for who would want to follow a dead man who has been in the ground for 2000 years. The Resurrection gives us hope of what is to come. One of the things to come (if we are faithful to God) is a glorified body.

As human persons, we are composed of both a body (physical) and a soul (spiritual). We know the physical because we can see, touch, and feel it. We also know certain aspects of the spiritual, although we cannot see it or touch it, we can certainly feel it (not from a physical perspective but from an interior perspective). We know this when we are heroic or virtuous or when we sin because we can feel something in us change or that is being moved to a different state. We can experience joy, peace, guilt, shame, etc, which are ways that we feel the state of our soul. Our body allows us to interact with others in our world and it informs and expresses the state of our soul. When we die, our bodies will decay, and yet our soul (which is immortal) will still exist. Then at the end of the world, our body will be raised up and in the rising from the dead, our bodies will be a more prominent display of our soul.

What will our glorified body be like? There is quite a bit of evidence from Scripture. On the day of the Resurrection, the Bible says that an angel came and rolled back the stone and the women who saw this being done, did not report anyone coming out of the tomb. Jesus did not need the tomb to be opened for him to get out but the women needed it so that they could go inside. Once inside, they see a young man clothed in a white robe (probably an angel) and then two men in dazzling white appear (probably two angels) and these encounters imply that a few characteristics of a glorified body are "youthfulness" and radiance (brightness). Jesus refers to this radiance: "Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father." (Mt 13:43) In the Transfiguration on Mount Tabor, Jesus is transformed and appears brilliant as light. "And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. "(Mt 17:2) His face being like the sun would have been so bright that one would not be able to look at it and even his clothes are changed. We read in Daniel about a heavenly man (probably the angel (Gabriel?)). "As I looked up, I saw a man dressed in linen with a belt of fine gold around his waist. His body was like chrysolite, his face shone like lightning, his eyes were like fiery torches, his arms and feet looked like burnished bronze, and the sound of his voice was like the roar of a multitude." (Dn 10:5-6) (Chrysolite is a yellowish precious stone.) We know that light is often correlated to the spiritual. Scientists say that the image on the Shroud of Turin (the burial cloth of Jesus) is most likely caused by a burst of radiation which only burned the top layers of the fiber. When Jesus' body was glorified, it became radiant and in the process a burst of radiation burst forth. So the glorified body will be bright and brilliant.

There will be varying degrees of brightness in glorified bodies as St. Paul states: "The sun has a splendor of its own, so has the moon; and the stars theirs. Even among the stars one differs from another in brightness. So it is with the resurrection of the dead." (1 Cor. 15:41) This indicates that there will be different levels of merit. The brighter that one shines, the more they have merited and thus the more glorious, they have a greater capacity of God's love. (Continued next week...)
