A Message from Fr. Kubista:

All of us are called to Heaven, to be with God our Father, Jesus our brother, and the Holy Spirit who makes us holy. But what is Heaven? The best place to go is to Scripture to see what it tells us about Heaven.

There are a number of references to "heavens" in Scripture. "In the beginning, when God created the heavens and the earth" (Gen 1:1) In the beginning implies when things began. God is self-contained; He has everything that He needs within Himself. Once He begins to create, those things He creates are outside Himself. Thus the heavens here could refer to both Heaven (where God is) and the sky, the universe and its expanse. At the end of the creation account we hear: "Thus the heavens and the earth and all their array were completed." (Gen 2:1) The start of the second creation account reads: "This is the story of the heavens and the earth at their creation. When the LORD God made the earth and the heavens." (Gen 2:4) The Psalms also references it. "By the LORD's word the heavens were made; by the breath of his mouth all their host." (Psalm 33:6) "Whom else have I in the heavens? None beside you delights me on earth." (Ps 73:25) "The heavens proclaim his righteousness, for God himself is the judge." (Psalm 50:6) "The heavens proclaim his justice; all peoples see his glory." (Psalm 97:6) St Paul talks about it in Colossians: "For in him were created all things in heaven and on earth, the visible and the invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers; all things were created through him and for him." (Col 1:16)

Other references point specifically to the "heavens" as the universe (sky). In Isaiah: "For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, my thoughts higher than your thoughts. Yet just as from the heavens the rain and snow come down And do not return there till they have watered the earth" (Isaiah 55:9-10) In the Psalms: "When I see your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and stars that you set in place" (Psalm 8:4) "Yours are the heavens, yours the earth; you founded the world and everything in it." (Psalm 89:12) "The heavens declare the glory of God; the firmament proclaims the works of his hands." (Psalm 19:2) In Wisdom: "For not without means was your almighty hand, that had fashioned the universe from formless matter." (Wis 11:17) In Jeremiah: "The one who made the earth by his power, established the world by his wisdom, and by his skill stretched out the heavens." (Jer 10:12) In Ecclesiastes: "There is an appointed time for everything, and a time for every affair under the heavens. "(Ecl 3:1) In Hebrews: "In these last days, he spoke to us through a son, whom he made heir of all things and through whom he created the universe, who is the refulgence of his glory, the very imprint of his being, and who sustains all things by his mighty word" (Heb 1:2-3) "By faith we understand that the universe was ordered by the word of God, so that what is visible came into being through the invisible." (Heb 11:3)

We hear about the new heavens and earth. In Isaiah: "See, I am creating new heavens and a new earth; The former things shall not be remembered nor come to mind." (Is 65:17) (See also Is 66:22) In Psalms: "Our help is in the name of the LORD, the maker of heaven and earth" (Psalm 124:8) Jesus tells us: "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away." (Mt 24:35) In Peter: "But according to his promise we await new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells." (2 Pt 3:13) In Revelation it says: "Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth. The former heaven and the former earth had passed away, and the sea was no more." (Rev 21:1) These references indicate that the former heaven and earth will pass away which indicates that these will be changed to a more glorious and fitting place for those who are just, righteous, and good.
