A Message from Fr. Kubista:

Corpus Christi (the Body and Blood of Jesus) emphasizes the physical aspect of Jesus. In his physical body, Jesus could suffer and thus offer himself as a sacrifice to the Father for our sins.

When Jesus (the Son of God) took on a human nature in the Incarnation, he united to himself all humanity who would choose to be united to him. Christ took on a body; he took on flesh like you and me. God the Father had this in His plan from all eternity. The body and the blood that Christ united with his divine nature, was significant. If all of creation is summed in Christ (who is both spiritual and physical) then it is through Christ by which all of creation can be reconciled to God the Father. Jesus enabled us to be adopted sons and daughters of God the Father through him in the power of the Holy Spirit.

We remember the events of the last moments of Jesus' earthly life, how he suffered for our sake. Christ went to his death after instructing his disciples at the Last Supper to do things in memory of him. In other words, they were to do what he was going to do, not only at the Last Supper, but the things that were to follow, including his death and resurrection. Christ willingly suffered in the flesh for the sins of the world so that the world (all creation) could be reconciled to God the Father. Unmerited suffering can occur in a body because one can experience suffering which at times is not a result of a sinful choice; we can suffer through no fault of our own.

Like Christ, we are called to suffer in the body for the salvation of the world. Christ elevates the body, the body is good so we are never to abuse our body. We should take care of our body, which is to be a temple of the Holy Spirit. Sometimes we suffer in our body as a result of something outside of our control. At times we do not deserve the suffering and we can offer it up so that in our body we fill in what is lacking in the suffering of Christ as St. Paul says: *"Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ on behalf of his body, which is the church, of which I am a minister in accordance with God's stewardship given to me to bring to completion for you the word of God, the mystery hidden from ages and from generations past."*(Col 1:24 – 26) The good angels in Heaven can not suffer because they never had the opportunity; they chose to be with God so they did not suffer. St Padre Pio says that suffering is one of the things they cannot do for God but we can. The bad Angels in Hell suffer but they cannot offer their suffering up to God. We can offer our suffering which is exactly what Jesus did. We are to offer our sufferings and unite them to Christ's for the praise and glory of God, to make amends for our sins and the sins of others.

We thank God the Father for sending his only begotten son, Jesus, to become man, to take flesh, to take on a body and blood, so that he could offer himself back to the Father as a humble sacrifice to reconcile all of creation with the Father. We ask that God the Father would help all of us to offer our lives as a living sacrifice to the Father, so that the Father can live and more and have His being in us through Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit. We pray that as the Mystical Body of Christ, (the Church) we may truly be an image of Christ to the world and fill up what is lacking in the sufferings of Christ in our body. God bless you.


Congratulations to Hunter and Lauren on the baptism of their daughter Dylan Ann Harnisch on Sunday May 31st. We welcome her into the Church.
