A Message from Fr. Kubista:

Vacation is a time to do something which refreshes us both in body and in spirit. It can uplift our soul to God, and help us grow in relationship with God, our families, and others.

Vacation can refresh us spiritually. It can help us grow in our understanding of ourselves, and think about how our lives are going? Are we going too fast or are we too stressed out? Are we doing those things that we like to do? Are we doing what God wants us to do and are we passionate about it? We may be doing the wrong things and too much of them, so to take some time to reflect and refresh ourselves spiritually may point us to a better balance in our lives where we are focused on the “right” priorities.

Vacation should refresh us physically. Vacation can allow us extra rest, extra sleep or relaxation, to be and not do. Sometimes vacation can be very busy and we may come back from it exhausted and not refreshed, which might be good but we should make sure it is helping us. We may come back from a vacation tired and at the same time refreshed, like going for a jog. If we are being refreshed physically and spiritually, then a busy vacation is good but if we are not then we should maybe do something different the next time. We should make sure that the vacation we go on is within our means, it is prudent for us to take and not extravagant. There are many simple ways to go on vacation and be refreshed.

Vacation is a great way for us to see different places and to experience God’s awesome presence in nature which can help us spiritually grow in our wonder and awe of God. Seeing the Grand Canyon, spending time at a lake or some other experience in nature, can help us appreciate more what a great gift God has given us in creation. When we experience creation, it can move us closer to God as He has designed it to do. We should allow creation to speak to us which might mean that we need to turn off the radio, the cell phone, or whatever else may distract us and allow the sounds of nature to speak to us of God and to hear the voice of God (the Spirit) moving in them. When we see different places it can help us more appreciate where we live.

Some of us have family who live a distance away. Taking a vacation to visit them is a great way to see another place and at the same time to talk with family to find out how things are going, and to spend some time with them doing fun things like playing games. We can spend quality time with them talking about important issues, like our faith and the things which are going on in our world. It is important support each other in our faith and to help each other stay aware of the things that are important to all of us.

Vacation is a great way for us to see other people and how they live. We have to remember that all of us are human beings and are called to the same destiny, to be with God. We are called to be a good example to those who we encounter on our vacation. We also should allow our experience of others and their culture to help us grow in a greater appreciation of them and their culture. We can learn new things and grow in appreciation of what we and they have. Vacation can help us to become more thankful for the many blessings we have been given.

As we plan and go on vacation this summer and throughout the year, let us see in our vacation its importance to refresh us both bodily and spiritually. We should make sure getting to weekend mass is on the itinerary and take some time during our vacation to pray and thank God for the many blessings that He has given us including being able to go on vacation. Festival Update


